Member Spotlight - Cathryn Hudin

Most groups and organizations have members that work tirelessly behind the day-to-day activities to ensure the success of the organization without thought of reward or recognition for themselves. This month's Paradise Art Center Member Spotlight recognizes Cathryn Hudin as such an individual.



Cathryn has been affiliated with the Paradise Art Center since 1980. She is best known as the Center's pottery instructor, but in that time she has also served over 30 years on the Board of Directors with over 12 of those years as Board President. Both the Camp Fire and pandemic took a toll on the Art Center and its classes. After the fire, the Art Center closed for over a year with

many Paradise residents relocating to other areas. However, Cathryn states "The commitment to the Art Center goes deep and so gradually our classes have grown and new teachers have emerged." For her the Art Center was an 'anchor' sustaining her and many of her students through those "dark times".

She attended her first pottery class in 1970, taking all the ceramics classes available and finished college with degrees in both Psychology and Fine Art/Ceramics

concentration. After over 50 years, she still finds the ceramics field exciting and enjoys the inherent element of surprise, good and bad, every time the kiln is opened. In addition to her first love, ceramics, Cathryn has also taken classes in glass blowing, jewelry making in ceramics and metal, silversmithing, fiber arts, and graphic design.

Her creative process often begins with an idea for a piece written down in a notebook followed by a quick thumbnail sketch then a detailed drawing or a "whole cartoon the size of the actual piece." She uses this process for sculptures and large tile wall murals. When throwing on a potter's wheel, her 50 years of experience allows her to create "almost anything that [her] body will allow".



Recently retiring from teaching pottery at Butte Community College after 45 years, Cathryn noted significant differences between the populations she taught at the college and the Art Center. Most college students enrolled



in one or two classes with few continuing onto a career or further studies. Many enrolled at the Art Center have taken Cathryn's classes for 5 to 30 years, becoming not only friends, but also family. Currently, there are even elementary school children in one of her classes.

Cathryn has written a handout for those thinking of taking her pottery class. Often people sign up for a pottery class with high expectations, but like most artistic endeavors practice and time are required for success. A project as simple as a 'pinch pot' might take as long as one to two months to complete. Beginning with a ball of clay, sticking a thumb in the center, pinching,

and turning the ball slowing opening and widening the hole then continuing to pinch the wall of the pot to make it an even thickness is only the start of the process. Next is decorating the surface, if desired, letting the pot



slowly dry, firing it in the electric kiln, glazing it and then firing it in the gas kiln. Finally opening the kiln to "enjoy your wondrous creation." Cathryn's creative philosophy is simple. "Making something beautiful enhances the whole world and you will be so happy you gave yourself this gift. Being creative is at the core of being human, let it come out in any form that makes you happy. Art connects us all."

Come Check Out Our Library!

Since the start of this year Paradise Art Center's art book collection has been reorganized by subject. The goal is to make the Center's art library resource more accessible to members. Bookshelves are being labeled by subject area and a "book basket" now sits under the workroom mailbox by the front door.

The new organization is quite informal. The Art Center has a very useful collection of first-rate art books covering a wide range of topics, including such specialties as jewelry making, china painting, and graphic design, for example, as well as the subjects you'd expect to find: drawing, anatomy, landscape topics, animals, and watercolor techniques.

The art collection is housed in the first six sections of the workroom's storage cabinet. A list of the shelf organization is pinned to the first cabinet section and is also available in the book basket. Another change is that the basket holds 3-by-5 cards to record books being used outside the library.

The new book basket is there to receive books after they have been used. It should make things more convenient for members and prevent books from being mis-shelved. The reorganization is all to facilitate better use of the library by members. If that means someone needs to use an art book at home, they fill out a card with the date, their name, and the name of the book and leave it in the basket. That way, if a teacher or another member needs that book, they can contact the person. When a member returns a book to the basket, they simply take their card out.

ago. Cathryn will be demonstrating hand building techniques and follow a project list. Students will receive a materials list the first day of class. Everyone will need to accomplish these basic skills before moving onto more complex projects. No previous knowledge of clay is necessary. Tools, clay types, kiln firing and other aspects of clay will be covered in detail. Monthly fee: \$48 members / \$60 non-members, plus lab fee. Minimum of six students. This class is ongoing for continued learning.

POTTERY - Intermediate/Advanced

ongoing, and meets every Monday. Pottery making takes time, often projects take two-three months to finish. Kilns are fired when there are enough pieces to fill them. More advanced levels of pottery will be covered including hand building, wheel throwing, glazing, and kiln loading. \$10 per class session, plus lab fee. This class is ongoing.
