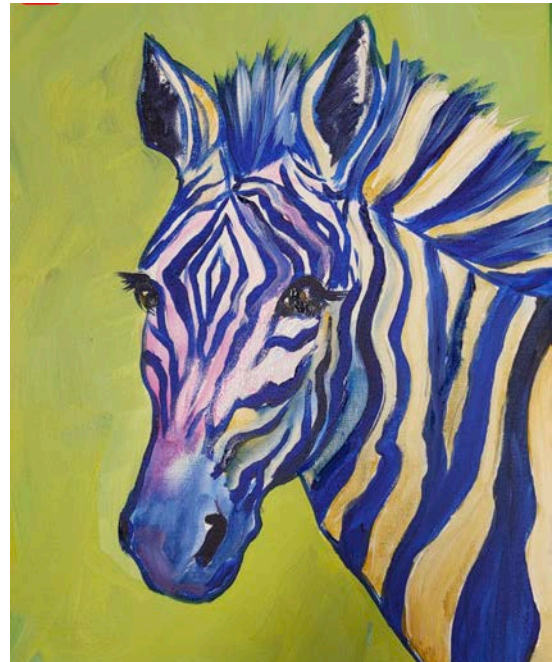
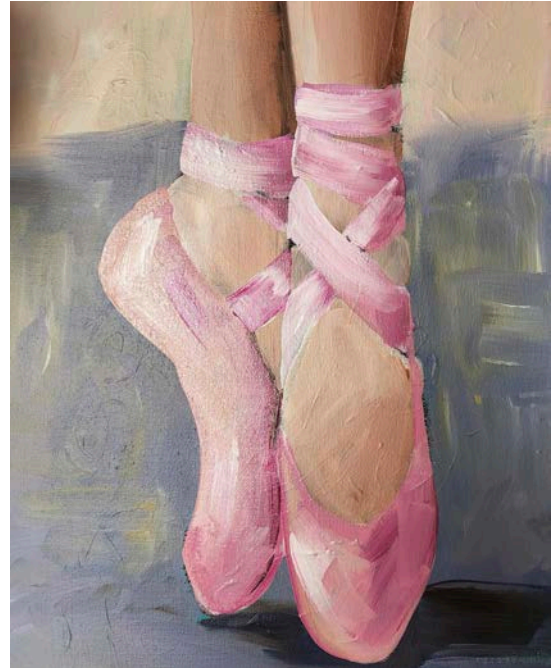

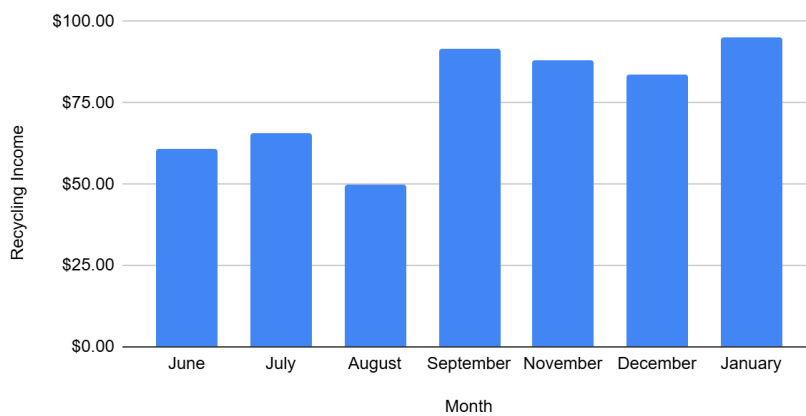
A Successful Opening Reception for the All Photography Show at Paradise Art Center

Member Spotlight – Patti Lloyd

Walking into a busy room filled with busy people moving about, you would likely immediately notice a woman whose demeanor invited you to engage her in conversation. That is exactly the type of person this month's Member Spotlight article is highlighting. Her name is Patti Lloyd and her commitment to the Paradise Art Center is extensive.

She joined the Art Center after the 2018 Camp Fire with a fervent desire to contribute to the rebuilding of the "Ridge" area. She realized the importance art could play in the healing process after trauma. Before the fire, her main creative outlet was working with clay and ceramics but turned to paper clay when she lost her studio and equipment. Delighted to discover the Art Center pottery program Patti was again able to work with ceramics and meet others sharing her interests. Patti also enjoys needle felting, assemblage, acrylic and watercolor painting and has taken advantage of opportunities at the Art Center to exhibit and sell her work.

When asked how art affected her early life, Patti responded that "Art has always been my passion since childhood." Enjoying art classes and the creative process, Patti still "struggled with feeling I wasn't good enough after high school to enter art shows." When she became a "mom" art was put in the "back seat." As her children grew older, she entered a watercolor painting in an art show and won a blue ribbon. With that encouragement she joined an art program at Jamestown Community College in Olean, New York and earned a 2-year degree.



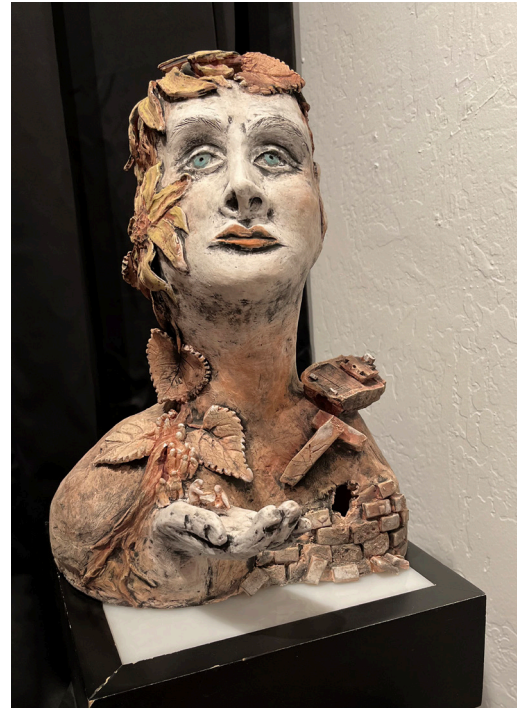
After earning her degree, Patti entered a period of location changes. First moving to Southern California where she took an enrichment class in ceramics at a local mission. Then moving north to Placerville and following her interest in ceramics with classes at Consumnes River College. When Patti came to Butte County she joined the ceramics community at Butte College, taking all the classes in ceramics and sculpture that were available at the time.

Patti's interest in a variety of art mediums is apparent in the artists and artisans she follows. Five of her favorites include Georgia O'Keefe, Andrew Wyeth, Alice Neel, Robert Arneson and Vincent Van Gogh. Her admiration for women artists is not only their talent, but their strength to believe in themselves. In addition to the more traditional artists, she admires Michael de Meng, a contemporary assemblage artist that has inspired her with his unconventional creativity.

In joining Paradise Art Center Patti brought with her a commitment to help the Art Center grow. Hoping to eventually see a new facility,

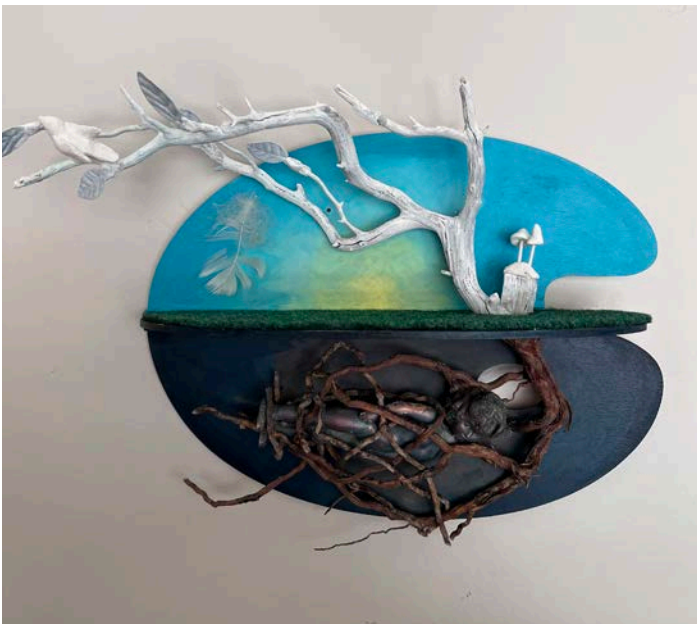

she accepts the reality of funding issues and therefore hopes to see the current facility continue with updated classrooms, equipment, and gallery. Patti also saw a need to tap into the amazing talent of Art Center members and created an easily accessible volunteer list. As a member of the Gallery Committee and Fundraising Committee, she has been the motivating force behind the creation of the 'Little Gallery' in front of the Art Center with the intent to "promote goodwill in the community and allow artists to contribute." The 'Little Gallery' houses small, donated artworks. These little treasures are available at no cost while new items are continually donated by member artists. In addition, Patti manages the cubicles located in the classroom area of the Art Center. The cubicles offer members a place to display and sell their art to other members and visitors thereby providing the opportunity to purchase original art and one-of-a-kind items while also supporting the Art Center. She feels that making art accessible creates a "connection between someone who creates art and someone who appreciates the life and enduring pleasure from an art piece."



Patti tirelessly promotes the Art Center in her personal volunteering capacity. In addition to her committee memberships, she has served overseeing an Open Studio in the pottery area, contributed art to the back garden area of the Art Center, created art for fundraising events, volunteered her time at various promotional events and coordinated the role of the Art Center in the 2024 Chocolate Festival. Thursdays 6 - 8 pm. In this introductory class all skill levels are welcome. We will learn the process of working with clay, its "rules" and tools and how to use them to create. We will explore the hand building techniques: coil building, slab rolling and the pinch pot method. In this class tools will be provided but, you are encouraged to find, make and/or purchase tools that you are interested in using as we explore. 4-week sessions. Saturdays 1 - 3 pm. In this intermediate/advanced hand building class one would be most successful entering it with basic knowledge of working with ceramic materials. In this class we will investigate the process of making repeatable forms and surface decoration with templating. We will practice various ways of handle clay and discuss the pros/cons of each process. We will practice forms such as mugs, bowls, trays/platters/plates with a foot ring. We will create a template together, use slump molds and learn about tools, materials and ways to troubleshoot creating wares in clay. 4-week sessions. Fees: Members: \$110, Non-members: \$120, includes lab fees and some material fees.
